Pray For The Peace Of South Africa!

The week of 11 – 15 September was another politically tumultuous period for South Africa. The fall out from massive Gupta related corruption scandals appear to be intensifying as the embattled ruling party approaches its National Elective Conference in December 2017.

The [Constitutional Court has reserved judgment](#) on whether Parliament should institute impeachment proceedings against President Jacob Zuma. The DA, EFF, Cope and the UDM want the court to order National Assembly Speaker Baleka Mbete to impeach President Zuma after the ConCourt ruled he deliberately lied to parliament over the Nkandla saga.

In the same week, the Supreme Court of Appeals reserved judgment in [President Zuma and the NPA's appeal](#) to set aside a High Court judgment that ruled the 2009 withdrawal of 783 corruption, fraud and racketeering charges against Mr Zuma was irrational.

And while President Zuma and the ANC battle on to avoid accountability for the countless cases of corruption, fraud, theft and the staggering mismanagement of state resources, multinationals like Bell Pottinger and KPMG paid the price for its relationship with the shady Gupta family.

The once respected UK PR company, [Bell Pottinger was ruined](#) by its association with the Gupta criminal enterprise. Auditing firm, [KPMG also felt the Gupta sting](#) when facts emerged of its collusion with the family to conceal misconduct. The CEO and six top partners were forced to resign.

The media reports the [Eskom board will be meeting](#) this week to discuss corruption and maladministration at the ailing parastatal. Eskom applied for a 20 percent increase in tariffs as it negotiates huge losses due to gross mismanagement and massive Gupta related corruption.

As this awful drama unfolds in the news media - rumours abound that President Zuma plans to reshuffle his cabinet so he can appoint ex-wife, Nkosizana Dlamini- Zuma to a top-level cabinet position to strengthen her chances of capturing the ANC presidency in December.

Dlamini-Zuma's ascendancy to the ANC presidency will ensure the status quo. President Zuma and a growing number of corrupt officials desperately need the protective cover of state office.

As the wicked connive and plot their evil deeds, the Church of Jesus Christ must urgently intercede for the nation. We must earnestly pray that God will intervene and rescue South Africa.

Political power is no match for the Power of Prayer. The Scriptures declare. "The effective and fervent prayer of a righteous man (woman) makes much power available" James 5:16.

Thankfully, there are numerous prayer initiatives currently taking place across the country. I urge you to join with believers in your region to earnestly pray for the peace of South Africa.
