In July Deputy President, Cyril Ramaphosa quoted from my newsletter at the SACP National Congress in Johannesburg that highlighted the many cases of corruption in South Africa.

Also in August, the “Coalition To End Sexual Exploitation South Africa” (CESESA) met at the FPI offices for a two-day workshop to hammer out a policy proposal on Adult Prostitution.

The FPI/CESESA Policy Proposal on Prostitution Law Reform was submitted to the ANC, ANC Women’s League, COSATU, the Gender Commission and all opposition parties in Parliament.

These are just some of the highlights of 2017. Sadly, FPI was forced to cancel its planned “International End Sexual Exploitation Summit” in South Africa due to lack of funding.

However, God guided the FPI team through the many challenges we faced this year. I am grateful to report we overcame every obstacle as a result of the wisdom, grace and provision of God.

Arlene and I extend our deep gratitude and appreciation to you, our faithful partners in

this vital ministry. Thank you for your valued prayers and loyal financial support during this year.

Without your vital partnership, this ministry cannot exist. Thank you for making our work possible. You have made the difference for faith, family and religious freedom in South Africa.
