For the first time in South Africa's democracy, a majority of citizens indicate no alliance to any particular party. That is 53 percent of voters – two thirds of whom are urban and under 35.

The relatively large number of registered parties is a clear indication of widespread unhappiness with the current political menu. New regional parties may also alter the political landscape.

Please join us in praying for change in South Africa. God is moving in response to the prayers of the saints. We dare not lose momentum. Pray, Stand and Act for South Africa.
