After Years Of Corruption Gloom, A Silver Lining Appears on South Africa's Horizon!

Arlene and I have been praying extensively for the country and our future this past three weeks. I can't shake the sense that South Africa is currently turning a decisive and positive corner.

I don't dream much. However, over the past three weeks I had several vivid dreams that woke me and kept me awake. One of the dreams that puzzled me involved President Cyril Ramaphosa.

In spite of the dire challenges facing the nation, a silver lining appears to be forming around the dark clouds. The anticipated massive drop in the fuel price in December must be welcomed.

Oil prices are declining and the rand appears to be holding its own despite volatile global markets. We may see the rand strengthening further and additional reductions in domestic fuel prices.

The [surprising resignation](#) of embattled Home Affairs Minister, Malusi Gigaba is an encouraging sign that even the most powerful ANC officials are being held accountable for facilitating the Capture of the State by the Gupta criminal family. Gigaba was a future presidential prospect.

While on the subject of the Gupta's, South Africa signed its [extradition treaty with the UAE](#) making it possible to extradite the Gupta brothers from their lair in Dubai to stand trial in South Africa. Hopefully, the Gupta's will be convicted of their crimes and the stolen billions recovered.

Continued testimony at the State Capture Inquiry has implicated several high-ranking ANC officials. The ruling party could be hollowed out by the Inquiry's conclusion next year.

More good news was the [Pretoria High Court's dismissal](#) of former President Jacob Zuma's appeal to declare legal his use of public funds for his numerous personal legal battles.

This means Mr Zuma's legal fees must be paid by himself and not the taxpayer. It also means he must repay the legal fees used for his personal defence already paid by the state since 2005.

Predictably, on 15 Nov the Joint Constitutional Review Committee [adopted the recommendations to amend section 25 of the constitution](#) to expropriate land without compensation.

Significantly, however, amending the constitution is a complex process and will not be finalised before the General Elections in May 2019. The ANC/EFF/UDM Alliance requires a two-thirds majority to pass the the amendment in Parliament. But voters may not give it to them next year.

In addition, President Ramaphosa was compelled to reassure the European Parliament that the land restitution process will be expedited strictly within the law while protecting human rights.

The Trump administration is also keeping an eye on land restitution in South Africa. International Relations Minister, [Lindiwe Sisulu will meet with US Secretary of State, Mike Pompeo soon](#) to discuss land restitution in SA. The US Government has demanded an orderly and just process.

Please continue to intercede for South Africa. God is at work in this nation. You and I may not always be aware of what God is doing. But we must trust Him for a miracle for this nation.
